ABSTRACT SUBMISSION PROCESS

Submissions should be completed electronically via the online <u>Abstract Portal</u> and will require the following:

- Presentation type
- Title
- Conference topic
- Presentation description (<350 words)
- Author/s details (including Name, Bios and Photos)
- AV requirements



In your presentation description please address the following questions, under these headings:

1. Background, Rationale, and Alignment

Describe what is already known about this topic, the gap, problem, or unmet need that the program, service, or initiative addresses, and explain how this work aligns with the conference's theme or topic.

2. Objectives

Clearly state the primary aim(s) or objectives of this program, service, or initiative, as well as the intended outcomes or learning points targeted.

3. Description and Innovation

Describe what you did, including details about the program, service, or initiative—such as the setting, context, participants, and format—and highlight what is new or innovative about your approach, content, or delivery.

4. Diversity and Inclusion

Explain how your program, service, or initiative includes or addresses diverse perspectives, experiences, or topics, highlighting relevance for underrepresented groups or varied viewpoints when applicable.

5. Speaker Qualifications

Outline the relevant experience or expertise that the presenters bring, optionally citing roles, lived experience, or unique abilities to engage the audience.

6. Interactivity and Engagement

Describe how your presentation fosters audience engagement, such as including discussion, Q&A, case studies, or other interactive elements.

7. Conclusions and Implications

Describe the key findings or insights, explain why this work is significant or relevant, and provide recommendations or implications for practice, policy, or future research.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- Submissions should be completed electronically via the online Abstract Portal.
- Multiple abstracts may be submitted by one individual/organisation
- The review committee reserves the right to adjust your chosen presentation type on your abstract submission to best suit the program.
- The presenting author/s are required to register for the conference to ensure their abstract is included in the final program. Up to 2 presenters of each successful application will be given a discount ticket offer.
