

# Beanbag Number Toss



On each number, draw the correct number of dots (one dot on one, two dots on two, etc) to aid in self-learning, checking and correcting

Learning to count takes time and practice. Counting is one thing and often comes before recognising numbers. By repetitively playing simple number recognition activities, children build their confidence.

This activity provides play experiences in mathematics and aids gross motor skills.

## What to do:

- + Using the coloured textas, write one number on each piece of paper and tape to a step on the staircase
- + Call out a number and encourage children to toss the bean bag onto the step that has the matching number
- + You could also try reversing it - toss the bean bag and then have your child call out the number it lands on

## What you need:

- Small squares of paper
- Coloured textas
- Bean bags or balled up socks
- Staircase or a few steps
